In keeping with the guidelines established February 2006 by the International Committee of Medical Journal Editors (*Uniform Requirements for Manuscripts Submitted to Biomedical Journals*), *IMCJ* requests the following:

**Humans:** When reporting experiments on human subjects, authors should indicate whether the procedures followed were in accordance with any ethical standards set by a governing committee responsible for human experimentation (ie, if applicable, a university review board) and with the Helsinki Declaration of 1975, as revised in 2000. (Please see [2000 World Medical Association Declaration of Helsinki](http://www.who.int/bulletin/archives/79(4)373.pdf). If for any reason the link does not work, the website is: [www.who.int/bulletin/archives/79\(4\)373.pdf](http://www.who.int/bulletin/archives/79(4)373.pdf)). If doubt exists whether the research was conducted in accordance with the Helsinki Declaration, the authors must, in a separate document, explain the rationale for their approach, and, if presented before a review body, demonstrate that the institutional review body explicitly approved the doubtful aspects of the study.
